

All paper products above must be EMPTY (No Lids / No Food / No Liquids).

Lakeshore Garbage Collection

Please keep your garbage properly secured - tie plastic bags, and make sure metal or plastic lids are fastened tightly. This prevents garbage from littering our neighbourhoods on windy days. Thanks!



Your garbage will be collected weekly on Monday, Wednesday or Thursday. We request that you locate your area on the map below and identify which day your area will receive weekly collection - look for symbols.

Place **GARBAGE** out for pick up the **NIGHT BEFORE** your scheduled collection day. Do **NOT** place garbage in roadway.

Large Items & Furniture: Will be picked up on your regularly scheduled garbage day (with the exception of white goods). Items such as box springs, mattresses, couches, chairs, and similar materials can be put out on any regular garbage day.

- NON-COLLECTIBLE Waste: Waste that is deemed non-collectible includes: Ammunition, animal carcasses, animal waste, appliances, automotive parts, bricks, combustibles, chemical waste, computer equipment, concrete, construction & demolition waste, explosives, industrial waste, liquid waste, medical waste, metal items, pallets, paint products, renovation debris, syringes, televisions, and tires. These items are not garbage and will NOT be collected - check index for Public Drop Off information.

White Goods

Appliance pick up includes: stoves, fridges, freezers, washers, air conditioners, dryers, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, trash compactors, & microwaves.

Household metal items include: hot water tanks, swing sets, metal sinks, barbecues, metal sheds, mowers, bicycles, garage doors, bathtubs, etc.

This service is **FREE OF CHARGE** for all Lakeshore residents.

All Areas: You must call Green For Life (known as GFL) at 519-944-8009 to arrange for this service.

You can drop off white goods, electonics, and televisions at the Public Drop Off Depot (see index). A fee will be charged will be charged for white goods containing a compressor.

The following items are **NOT** considered white goods: furniture, porcelain sinks / toilets (completely disassembled), mattresses, textiles, or miscellaneous garbage. Put out with regular garbage.

Acceptable Garbage Containers:

- Plastic Bags
 - · TIED Commercial grade plastic bags only
 - · Recommended size: 26" X 36"
 - · Never put sharp objects in plastic bags



- Metal or Plastic Cans
 - · Maximum 125L / 30 gal. capacity
 - · Maximum 78 cm/31" tall, 20" diameter
 - · 2 handles and a water tight lid



Unacceptable Garbage / Containers:

- Oversized and overweight: containers (over 20 kg / 45 lbs.)
- Waste that is deemed non-collectible includes: COMPUTER EQUIPMENT, TELEVISIONS, explosives, combustible, wet organic waste, liquid waste, animal carcasses, car parts, construction materials, industrial waste, pallets, and tires.

Hydrant Flushing: Hydrant flushing is a normal maintenance procedure and may result in customers experiencing rusty or milky water conditions. Please check when running water and if discolouration occurs, run cold water taps until the water clears. Hydrant flushing may occur between the hours of 7:00 AM and 3:00 PM.

All customers should note that flushing of watermains may be required without notification at various times throughout the year in order to ensure water quality. Thanks for your cooperation!

Yard Waste Collection

Basic Collection Requirements:

All areas will receive TWO (2) yard waste pick ups per month indicated by the yard waste bag (symbol). Please place your yard waste out the NIGHT BEFORE your scheduled collection day.

Area 1: April 19 to November 29 Area 2 & 3: April 26 to December 6



- If you must place grass clippings out, put them in garbage pails. Do NOT use plastic bags.
- Grass clippings will only be collected from April to December on your scheduled yard waste collection day. Grass clippings placed out for regular garbage collection will NOT be picked up.

The only **ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS**

for Yard Waste are:

- Paper Yard Waste Bags
- Cardboard Boxes
- Garbage Cans / Pails



No Plastic Bags for Yard Waste!

Yard Waste Preparation:

Yard Waste is defined as (grass, leaves, garden trimmings, brush & branches)

Tree / Hedge Trimmings:

Cut in 4 ft. lengths (max. diameter 2 ft.) and bundle securely. Not to exceed 45 lbs.

Large tree trunks or stumps will NOT be picked up.

Vegetation / Garden Waste:

Flowers, vegetable plants and fruit should be put in acceptable containers for collection (remove soil from roots).

Christmas Trees:

Remove ornaments, bags and stands. Recycle your tree at one of the designated depots (see January).



Look for the Paper Yard Waste Bag (symbol). It will indicate the date of your Yard Waste Collection Day.



Missed Garbage Collections

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

To ensure your materials are collected, please ensure they are:

- In acceptable containers
- Out the NIGHT BEFORE your collection day
- Within the weight limit of 20 kg (45 lbs)
- · Not hidden behind a vehicle, snow bank, or other obstruction
- · Free of prohibited content (e.g. hazardous or construction/renovation waste)

Other reasons for missed collections are:

- Holidays, please see calendar for updated dates
- Unacceptable containers, i.e. plastic shopping bags
- Not scheduled for collection that particular day
- Non-collectible waste i.e. computer equipment, televisions, renovation debris, animal waste, paint, medical waste, tires, concrete, appliances and metal items.

If an item is not collected for reasons other than the above, please contact Lakeshore at 519-728-2700. Please do not leave uncollected material at the curb while you are resolving the problem.

Lakeshore encourages residents to submit problems and issues they encounter with public infrastructure. Problems can be submitted via **online form** (QR code below) or by calling **519-728-2700**.

After Hours Urgent Calls

Lakeshore also offers an after-hours call service to respond to urgent issues with local infrastructure. The service can be accessed outside of regular business hours (Monday to Friday, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM) by calling **519-728-2700** and following the automated prompts.

If the problem you are reporting is an immediate threat to health and safety, please call 911.

When To Call After Hours?

- Missing stop signs or broken traffic lights

Lakeshore By-law Reminders:

Following these guidelines will help avoid any penalties and support the collective effort to maintain an orderly community environment. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping Lakeshore a safe and beautiful place to live!

Dogs Must Remain on Leash

All dogs are to remain on leash at all times in Lakeshore parks, unless while in an off-leash dog park in accordance with By-law 27-2022.

Lakeshore's By-law Compliance team are routinely visiting local parks to educate and remind dog owners about the by-law and, when necessary, enforce it with associated penalties. Learn more and read the entire by-law online at Lakeshore.ca/Bylaws

Property Standards and RV/Trailer Storage Reminder

Lakeshore's Bylaw Services Division is reminding residents about property standards and RV/ trailer storage. All property owners must:

Trim, cut, or destroy weeds or grass that are more than 20 cm in height.

Keep public property such as roads, sidewalks, and sewers free of grass clippings.

Store recreational vehicles and utility trailers in rear or side yards only. Front yard storage is not allowed in residential zones. All stored recreational vehicles and trailers must be owned, registered by the occupant or property owner, and kept in working condition. Recreational vehicles and trailers can be parked in driveways for loading or unloading for up to 14 days each year. Any time over 14 days is considered storage and must follow the side or rear yard storage rules.

Winter Snow Standards

Every owner must remove snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to their property within 8 hours of accumulation, and without damaging the sidewalk. Failure to do so may result in Lakeshore staff removing it, with it being up to the owner to cover the cost.

Never deposit snow on the roadway, it is an offence under the Highway Traffic Act.


During a snow event, always park vehicles in driveways and off local roads, whenever possible. If vehicles are blocking the roadway, Lakeshore staff may ask for vehicles to be moved.

Keep garbage and recycle bins on your lawn and off the roads. Ensure they are visible from the road.





Burn Permit Reminder

Before you plan your next fire or open burn, remember these guidelines:

Burning must be limited in size, depending on the fire type. Some fire types require a burn permit.

Access to water or other method to extinguish a fire is required.

No burning of leaves, phragmites, garbage, are shingles, are permitted.

Residential campfires may only burn clean, dry wood or charcoal.

Burning must be avoided if high winds could cause excessive smoke on neighbouring properties.

The EWSWA is rolling out the new Green Bin collection program to keep food waste and organics out of the Essex-Windsor Regional Landfill. Bin delivery to all single-family households in Phase1 runs from July to October. Over 150,000 homes will receive Green Bins, so please be patient – yours will be delivered before the October 21st program launch.
